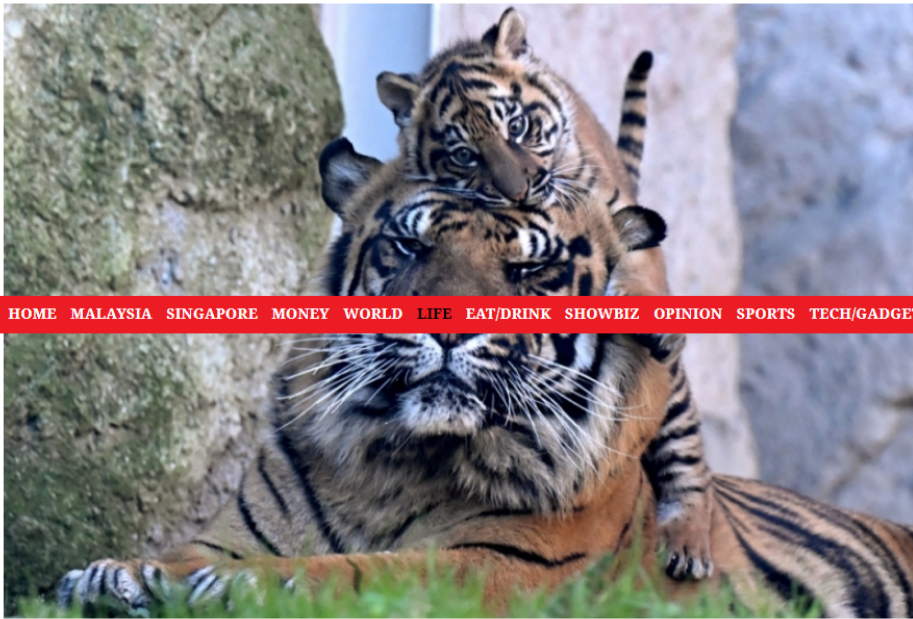

ROME, March 8 — A run around and a cuddle with dad — Rome zoo's new Sumatran tiger cub made her public debut Thursday, three months after her birth boosted the critically endangered species.

Visitors watching through the glass barrier expressed delight as the cub Kala explored her outdoor pen with her mother Tila and father Kasih — spending quite some time sitting on the latter's large, furry head.

"I didn't realise it would be so small, it's the size of our dog — it's magnificent!" said Arnaud Champalle a French tourist visiting the Bioparco zoo.

Sumatran tigers, named after the Indonesian island where they live, are the smallest species of tigers — and the rarest.

"There are about 500 of them left in the wild," said Paola Palanza, president of the Bioparco foundation.

"Therefore it's very important that zoos contribute to conservation strategies, maintaining a gene pool within zoos, so that we have a reserve of the species should we need to repopulate."

Tila was born in 2011 in Chester Zoo in England, while Kasih was born in 2014 in Beauval zoo in France.

Jakarta, IO – A three-month-old baby Sumatran tiger made its first public appearance at the Bioparco Zoo in Rome, Italy, Thursday (7/3).

The presence of a tiger cub named Kala also increases the number of Sumatran tiger species faced with extinction, per *Liputan6*, Mon (11/3).

Kala greets zoo visitors with her mother, Tila. He explored his cage and played with his mother.

The Sumatran tiger is the smallest and rarest species compared to other tiger species. Bioparco Foundation president Paola Palanza said the zoo wished to contribute to the conservation of the big cat.

"There are only about 500 left in the wild," said Paola. "Therefore, it is very important for zoos to contribute to conservation strategies by preserving the gene pool within the zoo."

Apart from the Bioparco Zoo, two Sumatran tigers were also born at the Memphis Zoo, Tennessee, United States. In May 2023, the baby tiger was born to a female named Dari (7) and a male named Gusti (4). The last Sumatran tiger was born at the Memphis Zoo in 1998. (un)

Kala aime bien s'allonger sur son père Kasih pour faire des câlins : née il a trois mois au zoo de Rome, cette petite tigresse de Sumatra a fait jeudi sa première apparition publique devant des admirateurs enthousiastes. « On a appris ça hier, alors qu'on préparait notre visite au zoo. Et donc aujourd'hui (...) on s'est dit, tiens, on va aller voir de plus près. Et je ne pensais pas que c'était si petit, elle fait la taille de notre chien, et c'est magnifique ! », a témoigné Arnaud Champalle, un touriste français de 41 ans, dans un entretien avec l'AFP-TV.

Le tigre de l'île indonésienne de Sumatra, l'une des plus petites sous-espèces de la famille des tigres, est considéré en danger d'extinction. « C'est une sous-espèce extrêmement rare. Il en reste environ 500 spécimens dans la nature », a expliqué la présidente de la Fondation du zoo de Rome, Paola Palanza, à l'occasion de la présentation au public du petit félin.

« On est très content de cette naissance »

« Il est donc très important que les zoos contribuent aux stratégies de conservation » en créant un fonds de gènes des tigres de Sumatra, « s'il devient nécessaire de les repeupler », a-t-elle ajouté. « On est très content de cette naissance. Trois mois se sont écoulés et elle va bien. On est content car il y a une famille, le papa, la maman et elle, qui n'ont jamais été séparés », s'est réjoui pour sa part un expert du zoo, Yitzhak Yadid.
